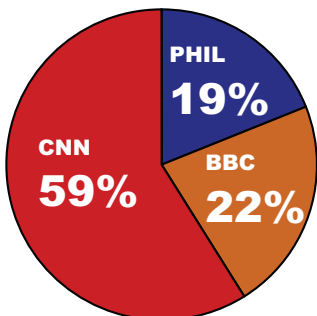

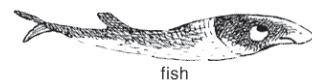
Beat Around The Bush

incredibly costly to implement only modest gains, and then they'd be taking away really good jobs from Americans! As it is, their presence and willingness to work for very little money lowers wages for hardworking but unskilled American laborers! It's unacceptable and must be stopped.

We have only one recourse: lower the cost that immigration forces us as a society to incur. And how do we do that? By attacking the very benefits the immigrants take from us! That's right, it's time to alter Social Security! Utterly destroying the current system would deter immigration, and make current immigration more affordable. Privatizing Social Security accounts sends a further "you're not welcome" message to anyone who isn't already a high wage earner in this country. It will be great! Please come check it out!

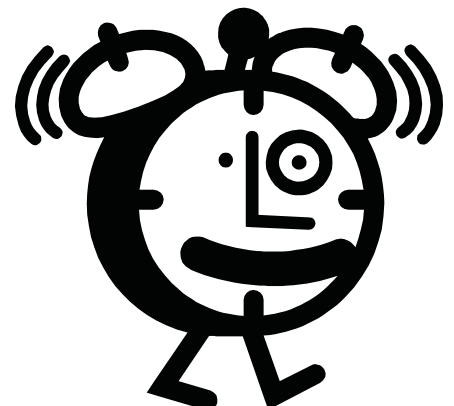

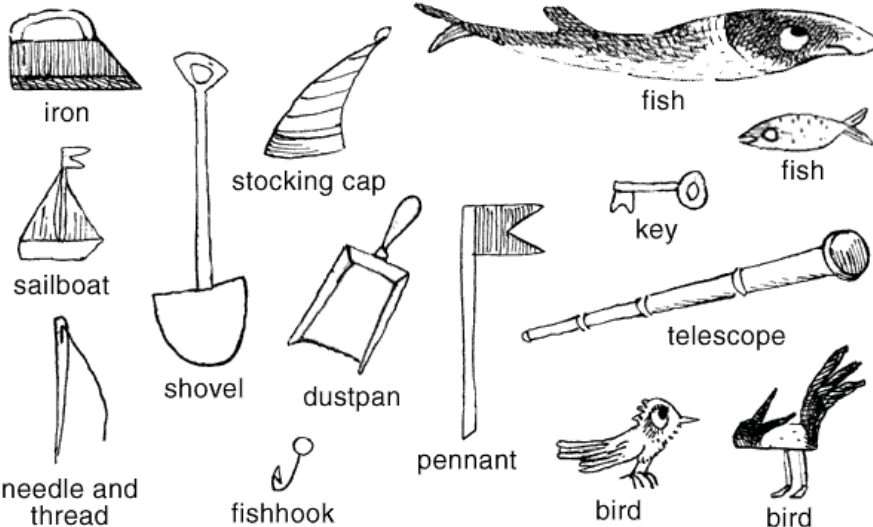

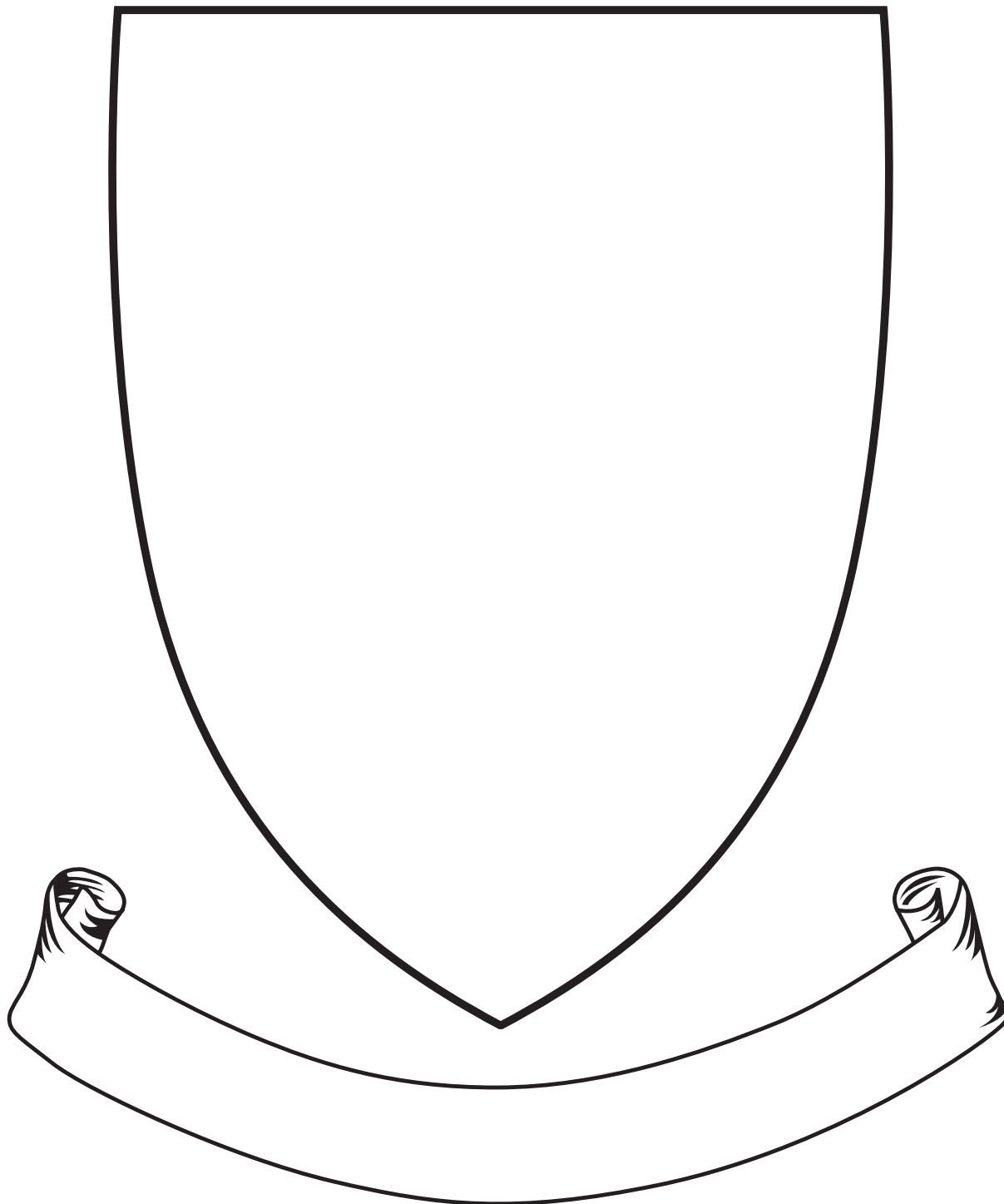
